The beautiful and intriguing disc of limestone you can see outside the Market Hall, on Chipping Campden's High Street, has been created by stone carver and artist Iain Cotton with places names from along the Cotswold Way, providing an invitation to walk, a welcome for tired feet and food for thought for the thousands of people that visit the town and walk the National Trail every week.

It is echoed by a similar marker at Bath Abbey: together they act as bookends for the Cotswold Way, marking the beginning and the end of one of the most iconic walking routes in the world.
