## **Countryside Officer & Footpath Secretaries' activities across the County**

#### **Redmarley Unclassified Road 40273**

There are two main means of access when walking in the countryside - Roads and Public Rights of Way. There are a number of classes of roads shown in various colours on OS maps. As well as A and B roads there are C (or 3) roads as well as class 4, 5 & 6.

Lower class white roads are public when marked with green blobs.

40273 is a class 4 ancient holloway, whose closure is being opposed by Ramblers, Open Spaces Society and Trail Riders.





**STOP PRESS**-Path Saved at Cheltenham Magistrates

#### National Grid Pylons, Cleeve Hill

National Grid have begun a project to remove pylons and bury a 4-mile stretch of electric cables near the Cotswold Way within the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty between Postlip Mill and Dowdeswell. The intent is to reduce the visual impact of the overhead lines. A route for the cable trenches has been proposed ready for consultation and can be viewed at nationalgrid.com/electricity-transmission/cotswolds-project/

Works are anticipated to start in 2025 with the pylons disappearing in 2029. No path closures are currently planned during the excavation and construction.

#### **Drainage**

Water logged paths can be perhaps the biggest issue as we move through autumn into winter. Sometimes a bridge can be installed.



At Hempsted on the Glevum Way, Gloucester circular walk, the use of a drainage pipe is being considered to prevent waterlogged paths.



Twin-walled pipes can be dropped into ditches.



It's hoped that part of a legacy, kindly left by a Member, can help fund the project.

#### **A417 Missing Link is Underway**

Some paths are being extinguished for the scheme. Restricted Byway ACY26 at the far dumper truck has been diverted behind the hedge where a veteran tree has been saved.

When possible, retained paths are being kept open outside working hours and temporary diversions signposted when necessary.





## **Some Group Activities**

One of 59 Ramblers Areas, Gloucestershire has 8 Ramblers Groups: Cirencester, Forest of Dean, South Cotswold, Gloucester, Cleeve, North Cotswold, Gloucestershire Walking Group with its 20s-30s sub-group.

#### **Gloucester Group**

We decided to reduce the length of our walking programme from four to three months, starting in January 2024. This means issuing a two-month programme shortly. The main reason is difficulty in filling the programme some time ahead, especially in the fourth month.

Our June walking holiday at Elan Valley was attended by 22 members. The Lodge was comfortable, very good value and the food was excellent. Two guides were provided each day and the walks, plus their local knowledge, were superb.



On 5th July we celebrated our 40th anniversary with an evening walk and BBQ at Brookthorpe Village Hall. 50 members attended and we had a very successful and enjoyable event.

Our AGM will be held on Wednesday 15th November at the Upton St Leonards Pavilion. The Group's Annual Luncheon will be at Lilley Brook Golf Club on Thursday 18th January 2024.
